Our Members

Last year our members responded to 181 emergency calls. As of October 31, this year we have responded to 177 calls. Each year our volunteers provide over 3,000 hours of service to the community. This includes emergency calls, training and community activities. In terms of dollar value this adds up to nearly \$100,000 per year in tax savings for our residents.

Insurance Rating

This summer the Idaho Survey and Rating Bureau surveyed our fire district to evaluate our ability to respond to emergencies. The survey is very comprehensive and includes an in-depth look at training, equipment, apparatus, water delivery and more. I am very pleased to say that as a result of the hard work of our volunteers our insurance rating for those areas served by fire hydrants improved from a rating of 5 to a rating of 4. With a lower rating it is possible for those residents within 1000 feet of a fire hydrant to shop for insurance that may be available at less cost.

Help Us Find the Hydrant

Give your Fire Hydrant a Little TLC. Keeping weeds cut during the spring and summer and shoveling the snow around hydrants during the winter season helps us find and use the fire hydrants when they are needed. Remember to keep chimneys clean and your smoke detectors working. In the event of a power outage do not run open flame or catalytic heaters without making sure that there is plenty of ventilation, Electric heaters are a safer alternative indoors.



Grant Received

Hauser Lake Fire has received grants totaling \$30,000 this year to upgrade our communications. We continue to apply for other grants that can leverage our funds and save taxpayers money.

Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Hauser Lake Fire Department and Auxiliary has some funding available to provide smoke detectors for distribution to those in need within our district. Preference will be given to those considered "at risk" to fires, especially senior citizens and those who cannot purchase needed detectors due to financial issues. Please remember to check your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Generally these devices have a useful life of 10 years and many have become outdated and need to be replaced. Also remember to check the batteries in your alarms whenever it is time to change your clocks for daylight savings. If you need assistance checking your smoke or carbon monoxide alarms please feel free to call the fire station and we will be more than happy to assist you with changing batteries and/or cleaning out dust that may have accumulated.



Can We Find You????

During an emergency, time is critical. When you call 911 and we respond, be sure that we can find your home by having easily readable address numbers. This is especially important when visibility is poor, such as at night or during bad weather. The blue address signs can be ordered from us at the fire station, if that is what you would like. They are two sided and reflective and are sold at cost—just \$15. Otherwise, be certain that your address is visible by having good contrast and large enough numbers which are easily seen when driving in a
